Primary objectives:

- Provide up-to-date information about S&L
- Provide S&L expert contacts
- Provide regular news updates
- Provide user-friendly way for Key Contacts to update the database
- Provide “Communities of Practice” to harmonize and rationalize S&L

History:

2004	ESIS is created
2006	ESIS is improved and expanded
2007	CLASP becomes Secretariat
2011	New ESIS webpage is developed

CLASP serves as Secretariat of APEC ESIS under the direction of the APEC ESIS Project Overseer (currently NZ) and EGEE&C

Secretariat Responsibilities:

- Be a central repository for all economy contributions to ESIS;
- Request and collect updates to ESIS economy content;
- Integrate data inputs and other content to APEC ESIS from other sponsors (e.g. SEAD & CLASP);
- Develop and manage subcontracts to run, maintain and improve ESIS;
- Raise Funds for ESIS within and outside of APEC;
- Report to the Project Steering Committee twice a year at the EGEE&C meetings; and
- Develop and maintain a strategic Plan for long-term sustainability

The Collaborative Labeling and Appliance Standards Program's (CLASP) mission is to serve as the primary international voice and resource for practitioners of energy efficiency standards and labeling (S&L) worldwide

CLASP roles:

- APEC-ESIS Secretariat
- ClimateWorks Foundation (CWF) Best Practice Network (BPN) for S&L
- Super-efficient Equipment and Appliance Deployment (SEAD) Initiative Operating Agent

Operations, Maintenance, and Web Development Updates:

- CLASP has initiated the development of a new webpage for ESIS
- Current ESIS website has been operational without interruption
- As-needed technical maintenance and incident trouble-shooting; no trouble since last report

Content Updates:

- CLASP has initiated a comprehensive update to database entries for multiple APEC economies (Australia, Canada, Chile, Chinese Taipei, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, People's Republic of China, & United States)
- Sent email notification to Key Economy Contacts requesting updates and What's New Articles
- Over 109 updates including Canada, Mexico, and Russia

APEC-ESIS has received generous support from SEAD to fund the following:

- Development of a new webpage for ESIS;
- Website hosting and maintenance;
- Update of economy content in the database;
- CLASP's continued role as ESIS Secretariat; and,
- CLASP's participation at APEC meetings

- 1. Current ESIS website will be retired in December of 2011**
- 2. New ESIS webpage will launch at the end of November**
- 3. Fundraising is needed to improve and enhance the new ESIS webpage**
- 4. CLASP's new S&L Search Tool will have an APEC specific search function**

Timeline of events:

- **November 2010** – CLASP announces that it will move its website and database from IIEC to a new web server, which will increase the cost of maintaining ESIS
- **March 2011** – SEAD offers to fund the development of a new ESIS webpage
- **August 2011** – CLASP proposes a plan for developing the new ESIS webpage
- **September 2011** – ESIS Project Steering Committee votes out of session to retire the current ESIS website and replace it with a new ESIS webpage
- **October 2011** – CLASP initiates development of the new ESIS webpage


