Executive Summary

In 2024, the SOM Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) was hosted by Peru and held all three meetings in-person with SCE1 and SCE3 taking place in Lima and SCE2 taking place in Arequipa, Peru. Mr. Hee-Sang KIM, APEC Senior Official for the Republic of Korea, served as Chair, with Ms. Carolina Carranza from Peru serving as the Vice Chair. The SCE also held the 19th annual SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) meeting and an informal meeting of SCE sub-fora Chairs and Lead Shepherds. In addition, the SCE conducted business through intersessional discussions and exchanges.

Over the course of the year the SCE provided oversight and direction to the SCE fora in the conduct of various workshops, publication of several reports, and the accomplishment of economic and technical cooperation activities through cross-cutting policy initiatives and projects facilitated by the Committee's endorsement of the 2024 SCE Annual Work Plan. Information on the year in review, including these activities, can be found in **Section 2**.

Further, the APEC Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Award, launched in 2023, recognized the achievements of individuals and organizations that have advanced sustainable and inclusive growth objectives with three winners officially announced and awarded a USD 5,000 cash prize for their outstanding efforts in furthering BCG Economy approaches at the APEC Ministerial Meeting in Lima, Peru in November.

The SCE continued its central role in the administration of SCE sub-fora, approving the annual work plans of 14 SCE sub-fora and endorsing the Small and Medium Enterprises Working group (SMEWG) Strategic Plan (2025-2028). Additionally, SCE also oversaw and coordinated the work of SCE's 14 sub-fora. Some of the notable outcomes this year, in support of APEC 2024 host year theme: "Empower, Include, Grow," the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040), the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA), the Bangkok Goals on Bio-Circular and Green (BCG) Economy as well as ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities included:

Nine sectoral ministerial meetings and high-level dialogues were hosted by Peru, with the support and contribution of SCE fora:

- The Policy Partnership for Women and the Economy (PPWE) collaborated to support the **Joint Meeting of APEC Ministers Responsible for Women and Trade** and the **Women and the Economy Forum (WEF)**;
- The Tourism Working Group (TWG) assisted in the organization of the 12th Tourism Ministerial Meeting;
- The Energy Working Group (EWG) contributed to the 14th APEC Energy Ministerial Meeting (EMM);
- The Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) assisted in the hosting of the **17th Senior Disaster Management Officials Forum (SDMOF)**;
- The Health Working Group (HWG) supported the 14th High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy;
- The Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) worked in support of the **9th Food Security Ministerial Meeting**;
- The Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) supported the hosting of the **30th APEC Small and Medium Enterprises Ministerial Meeting (SMEMM)**; and
- The SCE assisted with the organization of a High-Level Dialogue on Mining.

Additional efforts included a variety of actions and initiatives including, among others:

• The SCE endorsed "The APEC HRDWG Arequipa Goals," aimed to empower people with disabilities to actively contribute to sustainable and inclusive economic growth in the APEC region. Additionally, the Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG) developed toolkits and programs to enhance digital skills and literacy, addressing the digital divide and promoting green vocational skills as well as promoting the fundamental principle of occupational safety and health in the workplace.

- The HWG hosted policy dialogues on epidemic intelligence, genomic medicine, health workforce planning, value-based healthcare, digital health technologies, focusing on equitable health services and public-private partnerships.
- The Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG) organized workshops on digital technologies, conformity assessment, and intelligent transport systems, promoting secure ICT environments and economic aspects of spectrum management.
- The SMEWG focused on enhancing connectivity, trade, investment, and women's economic empowerment through workshops and reports on digital connectivity and global value chains. Further the SMEWG introduced strategies to deal with informality through digitalization of government services, advisory services, and workshops on digital connectivity.
- The Expert Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT) adopted policy themes and published compendiums to promote legal timber trade and enhance stakeholder collaboration.
- The Policy Partnership on Science Technology and Innovation (PPSTI) advanced sustainability and technology innovation and advancement goals through workshops and symposiums as well as cross-fora collaboration to address challenges in circular economy, climate change, low carbon technologies, bioenergy technologies, high performance computing infrastructure, industry 4.0 technology adoption, smart hospitals, precision fishery model, open science, and traditional knowledge.
- The Ocean and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG) implemented roadmaps on marine debris, illegal fishing, and small-scale fisheries, aligning with sustainable resource management priorities.
- The TWG published the "Tourism Crisis Management Communication Plan" and an "APEC Sustainable Tourism Evaluation Tool for Visitor and Destination (ASTET)," along with five detailed reports addressing various challenges and opportunities within the tourism sector. The group organized seven workshops focusing on digital tools for transitioning to a formal economy, youth involvement in sustainable tourism, and best practices in managing tourism sustainably in vulnerable areas, among others.
- The Agriculture and Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG) worked jointly with the Policy Partnership on Food Security (PPFS) in developing the "Trujillo Principles for Preventing and Reducing Food Loss and Waste in the Asia-Pacific Region."
- The EPWG advanced disaster resilience through initiatives like early warning systems, climate change adaptation, and inclusive growth strategies.
- The EWG reached consensus on the Just Energy Transition Initiative, as directed by ministers in 2023 and completed several workshops, including one related to the theme of advancing green and low-carbon hydrogen transition.
- The Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG) focused on enhancing integrity and anticorruption efforts through a series of key deliverables. These included the organization of a seminar to share best practices in public sector integrity, and a workshop on mutual legal assistance to deny safe haven for corrupt actors.
- The PPWE collaborated with various APEC fora to organize and execute a series of impactful workshops, dialogues, and initiatives focused on women's economic empowerment. These efforts encompassed a diverse range of topics, including enhancing the practical applications of digital technologies to support women's economic empowerment, strengthening women's leadership in addressing environmental challenges and promoting gender equality through structural reform principles.

• The Transportation Working Group (TPTWG) delivered key outputs through seven project events, including workshops and forums, and the publications of five reports addressing critical issues such as resilient supply chains, sustainable transport solutions, and gender inclusion in the workforce. Notable initiatives included workshops on mobility integration and the publication of reports on maritime transport challenges and innovative greenhouse gas reduction strategies.

The SCE also began the SCE Standardized Sub-fora assessment concluding seven of the assessments in 2024.

Additionally, the SCE benefited from voluntary updates delivered by two SCE members highlighting their domestic efforts to advance the APA's individual actions. Stakeholder engagement and cross-fora collaboration was also strongly encouraged, as evidenced by the number of events involving internal and external stakeholders held throughout the year.

A discussion of the above and other highlights and priorities, including the financial contributions of APEC economies to the APEC Support Fund's various sub-funds are set out in **Section 3**.

Each SCE sub-forum also reports on projects, both funded by APEC and self-funded by economies, undertaken in 2024 through Fora in Action tables outlined in **Section 4**. The tables include a listing of all projects currently in implementation phase, concept notes that have received in-principle BMC approval as well as details of various plenary meetings, events and workshops held throughout the year.

1. Introduction

The 2024 SOM Steering Committee on Economic and Technical Cooperation (SCE) Report offers a detailed overview of the SCE's key priorities, initiatives, and achievements from the year. This report highlights the collaborative efforts of APEC member economies to foster economic and technical cooperation, addressing both the challenges and opportunities faced by the region.

Throughout the year, the SCE and its sub-fora have reached significant milestones and accomplishments. This includes successful projects and collaborations aimed at enhancing economic and technical capabilities among member economies. The report underscores the importance of partnership and engagement across APEC fora and with external partners, emphasizing the cooperative spirit that drives the organization's success. Additionally, it identifies areas where further activities and cooperation could be explored.

2. A year in review

In 2024, APEC member economies progressed in a range of areas of economic and technical cooperation, with the SCE and SCE sub-fora providing contributions in training, skills development, and information sharing. The SCE was chaired by Mr. Hee-Sang KIM, APEC Senior Official for the Republic of Korea, with Ms. Carolina Carranza from Peru serving as SCE Vice Chair. The Committee met on three occasions and accomplished the following:

- Endorsed the SCE Annual Work Plan for 2024;
- Endorsed 14 SCE sub-fora annual work plans and one SCE sub-forum Strategic Plan;
- Held a Policy Dialogue on "Understanding the Nexus between Digital Connectivity and Formalization in Asia-Pacific;"
- Completed seven SCE Sub-fora Standardised Assessments, providing recommendations, agreed to by Senior Officials to renew all seven SCE sub-fora;
- Launched the 2024 APEC Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Award, with a robust level of participation from across APEC's membership;
- Received updates from two economies on efforts to advance the APA individual actions, in conformance with the instructions outlined in the Aotearoa Plan of Action;
- Endorsed the "APEC HRDWG Arequipa Goals" and the paper on "Integrating APEC's Inclusive Growth Agendas;"
- Endorsed the SMEWG Strategic Plan (2025-2028), SMEWG Terms of Reference (TOR) (2025-2028); SME Service Alliance ToR (2025-2028); SME Crisis Management Centre ToR (2025-2028); SME Innovation Centre ToR (2025-2028) and Transportation Working Group ToR (2022-2025);
- Coordinated the work of SCE sub-fora to facilitate alignment with the APV2040 and the APA; and
- Provided direction to SCE sub-fora on Work Plans, Strategic Plans, and Terms of Reference.

The first SCE meeting of the year was held on 6 March 2024 in Lima, Peru with twenty-one APEC economies as well as the ABAC and PECC Secretariat represented. During this meeting the SCE noted the SCE 2024 Work Plan and Peru's update on the outcomes of the SCE Policy Dialogue: "Understanding the Nexus between Digital Connectivity and Formalization in Asia-Pacific." Additionally, updates from Australia and the United States on their Individual Actions under the Aotearoa Plan of Action were also noted. Further, the SCE benefited from briefings by Viet Nam on its paper: "Integrating APEC's Inclusive Growth Agendas" and from Thailand on the 2024 APEC BCG Award process. The HRDWG Lead Shepherd apprised members on the implementation of the "HRDWG Detroit Non-Binding Principles and Recommendations for Equality and Inclusion in Education, Training, and Employment," including the establishment of a Friends of the Chair (FotC) on Promoting Disability Policies. The SCE also noted the proposed revision to the Expert Group on New and Renewable Energy Technologies (EGNRET) Terms of Reference and recommended that Senior Officials instruct EWG and EGNRET to consider additional options to boost attendance at EGNRET meetings. Furthermore, the SCE noted the Fora Assessment Report for the Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG) and

recommended the renewal of the SMEWG, providing instructions for follow-up actions to be undertaken by SMEWG.

The SCE Committee of the Whole (SCE-COW) held on 5 March 2024 in Lima, Peru, resulted in several key outcomes, including the endorsement of the work plans of ten SCE sub-fora: the Agriculture Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG), Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG), Energy Working Group (EWG), Expert Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT), Health Working Group (HWG), Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG), Policy Partnership for Science, Technology and Innovation (PPSTI), Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG), Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG), and Tourism Working Group (TWG). Additionally, the SCE took note of interventions and updates from various SCE sub-fora and emphasized the importance of aligning work with APEC 2024 priorities, the Putrajaya Vision 2040, and the Aotearoa Plan of Action.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the 2023 work plans for the Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG), Ocean and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG), Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE), Transportation Working Group (TPTWG). Additionally, the SCE endorsed the update to the TPTWG Terms of Reference (2022-2025).

The second SCE meeting was held on 14 May in Arequipa, Peru with 20 economies as well as PECC Secretariat represented. The SCE noted several updates and presentations during the meeting. Peru provided an update on the upcoming 2024 Sectoral Ministerial Meetings and High-Level Dialogues. PPWE Chair updated on operationalising the findings and recommendations of the La Serena Roadmap on Women and Inclusive Growth Implementation Report in 2024. EPWG Co-Chairs presented the key outcomes of the 20th EPWG Meeting, and Peru briefed on the key outcomes of the 17th Senior Disaster Management Officials' Forum. The APEC Secretariat presented the findings of the 2023 APEC Perception Survey and the "2024 Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work," along with the implementation of ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities reflected in 2024 SCE sub-fora work plans. The SCE also noted the SCE Standardised Sub-fora Assessment Reports for the ACTWG, EGILAT, and PPSTI. The SCE recommended the renewal of the ACTWG and the PPSTI with follow-up instructions for sub-fora action, while noting a lack of agreement among members on the renewal of the EGILAT. The SCE committed to continue working intersessionally towards a consensus recommendation. China presented a proposal to establish a new APEC Support Fund sub-fund on Green and Digital Transitions with an initial contribution of USD 1 million.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed "The APEC HRDWG Arequipa Goals," aimed to empower people with disabilities to actively contribute to sustainable and inclusive economic growth in the APEC region. Further, the SCE agreed to the "Integrating APEC's Inclusive Growth Agendas" paper incorporating the review of the 2017 APEC Action Agenda on Advancing Economic, Financial, and Social Inclusion into the existing review and reporting requirements of the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the Aotearoa Plan of Action to avoid duplication and streamline efforts. Further, a symposium on "Promoting Green and Low-carbon Transition through Digital Technologies for Inclusive and Sustainable Growth in Asia-Pacific" (SCE 01 2023S) was held in Guilin, China, with approximately 180 representatives from 10 APEC economies in attendance.

The third SCE meeting was held on 23 August in Lima, Peru, with twenty economies in attendance. At this meeting, the SCE noted the APEC Secretariat's update on outcomes from Project Session One. Additionally, Australia's progress in advancing the Aotearoa Plan of Action Individual Actions through <u>Australia's Disability</u> <u>Strategy</u> (2021-2031) was acknowledged. The SMEWG Chair provided an update on operationalizing the SCE's renewal recommendation, including revising the SMEWG and its sub-bodies' Terms of References, the SMEWG Strategic Plan, and other follow-up actions. Similarly, the ACTWG Chair's Assistant updated on operationalizing the SCE's renewal recommendation, including revising the ACTWG and the Network of Anti-Corruption Authorities and Law Enforcement Agencies (ACT-NET) Terms of References and other follow-up actions. The SCE noted a presentation by the APEC Secretariat on the status of the SCE's recommendation to renew the EGILAT and endorsed the decision to recommend that Senior Officials renew the mandate of the sub-forum. They also noted the Fora Assessment Reports for the EWG, the OFWG, and the PPWE. The SCE

recommended the renewal and provided instructions for follow-up actions to be undertaken by the abovementioned SCE sub-fora.

Intersessionally, the SCE endorsed the SMEWG Strategic Plan (2025-2028), the SMEWG Terms of Reference (ToR) (2025-2028); the SME Service Alliance ToR (2025-2028); the SME Crisis Management Centre ToR (2025 – 2028) and the SME Innovation Centre ToR (2025-2028). Further, the SCE endorsed the "Summary Report: APEC Symposium on Green and Low-carbon Transition through Digital Technologies (SCE 01 2023S)." Additionally, a virtual symposium took place on Sustainable Cities Development to Promote Inclusive and Sustainable Growth in Asia-Pacific from 5 to 6 of September 2024. Furthermore, China's proposal to create an ASF Sub-Fund on Promoting Digitalisation for Green Transitions was endorsed by the SCE, with an initial contribution of USD 1 million expected from China in due course.

Further, 2024 served as the second year of the Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Award with three winners in the categories youth, women and MSMEs recognised for their exceptional contributions to furthering the BCG model across the APEC region at the APEC Ministerial Meeting (AMM) in Lima, Peru on 14 November 2024.

3. Priorities and Accomplishments

3.1 Host Economy Priorities

During the year, the SCE and its sub-fora discussed the host year theme of **"Empower, Include, Grow."** and its three priorities of "Trade and investment for inclusive and interconnected growth;" "Innovation and digitalisation to promote transition to the formal and global economy;" and "Sustainable growth for resilient development" through an extensive and varied range of activities. The SCE fora worked in support of the host economy in the achievement of high-level outcomes at nine APEC ministerial meetings and high-level dialogues:

- The PPWE supported the <u>High-Level Policy Dialogue on Women and the Economy</u>, which took place in Arequipa, Peru, during which a <u>2024 APEC Women and the Economy Forum Ministerial Statement</u> was agreed. The Statement encouraged the economic empowerment of women and girls of diverse backgrounds by overcoming barriers to gender equality, supporting inclusive and sustainable growth, enhancing women's participation in STEM fields, advancing women's financial inclusion, and using ICTs to prevent and respond to gender-based violence.
- Further, the PPWE collaborated to support the **Joint Meeting of APEC Ministers Responsible for Women and Trade**, in Arequipa, Peru where members agreed to a <u>Joint Statement of APEC Ministers Responsible</u> <u>for Women and Ministers Responsible for Trade</u>. This statement underscored the importance of inclusive economic growth, women's full participation in the economy and regional and global trade and taking concrete actions to advance women's economic empowerment through collaboration among APEC members.
- The EPWG assisted in the hosting of the **17th Senior Disaster Management Officials Forum (SDMOF)** which focused on emerging hazards, such as wildfires and the El Niño phenomenon, alongside DRR and preparedness efforts. The SDMOF highlighted the importance of human security by helping economies anticipate and respond to disasters, with a strong focus on building community resilience and implementing early warning systems to improve hazard management.
- The TWG assisted in the organization of the **12th Tourism Ministerial Meeting** in Urubamba, Peru where Ministers agreed to <u>a Joint Statement</u> that highlighted the need for resilient growth, efficient waste management, and cross-fora collaboration to achieve inclusive and sustainable tourism development.
- The ATCWG worked in support of the **9th Food Security Ministerial Meeting**; in Trujillo, Peru where members adopted the <u>Trujillo Statement</u>, which underscored the necessity for extensive collaboration in key areas to bolster food security and resilience in the Asia Pacific region. The meeting also adopted the "Trujillo Principles for Preventing and Reducing Food Loss and Waste in the Asia-Pacific Region," which outlined seven key actions to improve food security and address related economic, social and environmental challenges.
- The EWG contributed to the **14th APEC Energy Ministerial Meeting (EMM)** in Lima, Peru, where Ministers agreed to the Lima Statement, affirming APEC's commitment to ensuring energy security and resilience, accelerating clean and sustainable energy transitions, and fostering international cooperation to support energy infrastructure and innovation. Additionally, Ministers agreed to the "APEC Policy Guidance to Develop and Implement Clean and Low-Carbon Hydrogen Policy Frameworks in the Asia-Pacific," to advance energy transitions across the Asia-Pacific region and welcomed efforts towards the "Just Energy Transition Initiative."
- The HWG supported the **14th High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy** in Lima, Peru where APEC members adopted <u>a consensus statement</u> focused on four priorities: the intersection between gender

equality and health; universal and community mental health and wellbeing; the impacts of climate change on health; and the importance of immunization throughout the course of life.

- The SMEWG supported the hosting of the **30th APEC Small and Medium Enterprises Ministerial Meeting** in Pucallpa, Lima where Ministers and representatives adopted the <u>Pucallpa Statement</u>, emphasising quality growth for MSMEs by addressing their challenges and unlocking their potential and to promote the transition of MSMEs to the formal economy and enhance their participation in the global economy through innovation and digitalization.
- The SCE assisted with the organization of a **High-Level Dialogue on Mining**, in Lima, Peru, where APEC members agreed to the Lima Statement on Mining, encouraging members to sustainably investment in mineral resource production and processing to support energy transitions, fostering innovation and investment in the mining industry, and addressing challenges associated with artisanal and small-scale mining.

In addition to the above Ministerial meetings, the SCE's contributions in progressing the 2024 host year priorities were manifold and included:

1). Trade and investment for inclusive and interconnected growth

In 2024, the SCE and its sub-fora worked to advance the Peru host year priority of "trade and investment for inclusive and interconnected growth" through numerous actions, initiatives and outcomes.

The HRDWG sought to improve physical, institutional, and people-to-people connectivity, with the APEC Climate Economics Cross-Border Educational Course held in April, which facilitated the exchange of information and practical guidelines among APEC economies. Additionally, the 2024 APEC Industry-Academia Collaboration Workshop in August provided best practices for inclusive innovation, digital sustainability, and talent development, involving education policymakers, industry representatives, and academia from APEC economies.

Further, in 2024 the EWG worked to improve standards and conformance systems, resilience supply chains and quality investments with workshops on "Definitions, Codes, and Standards for Green and Low-Carbon Hydrogen" and on "Investment Environments and advancements in the value chain for Green and Low-Carbon Hydrogen" in May.

Within the HWG several key policy dialogues were hosted to address critical health challenges, including "Epidemic Intelligence and Essential Workforce Mobility," examining policies for tracking and mobilizing essential workers during pandemics while enhancing surveillance systems for early disease outbreak warnings. Additionally, the use of digital health technologies to tackle One Health challenges and ensure equitable health services for vulnerable populations were also considered. Further dialogues with a focus on medicines and access, highlighting the private sector's role in improving access to health treatments and strategies to reduce waiting times for diagnostics and treatments. Additional discussions were held in August which addressed the economic impact of health, exploring investment strategies and the significance of public-private partnerships in financing and advancing health sector development.

In 2024, the TELWG successfully organized a series of workshops aligned with its strategic priorities, focusing on critical topics in the telecommunications sector. Key workshops included discussions on new and emerging digital technologies aimed at promoting a secure and trusted ICT environment, which took place in China. Additionally, the working group addressed the "Conformity Assessment Framework for Telecommunications Equipment" in a workshop held in Malaysia, emphasizing the balance between regulatory compliance and trade facilitation. Further initiatives included exploring best practices for Mutual Recognition Agreements in conformity assessment in the United States, as well as examining Intelligent Transport Systems in Mexico and the economic aspects of spectrum management in Russia.

Moreover, the TELWG initiated several innovative projects and inclusion efforts. Notable workshops featured the Smart Silver Innovation Project in Japan, which targets aging populations, and the Digital Innovation for Women's Advancement (DIWA) initiative in the Asia-Pacific region, held in the Philippines. The group also presented case studies on Indigenous Digital Inclusion in Australia and conducted a workshop on meaningful and universal connectivity in APEC economies in Peru. Additionally, a session on expanding broadband access through Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellite communications systems was hosted in the United States. These initiatives collectively contributed to fostering innovation, enhancing digital inclusion, and strengthening collaboration among member economies.

In 2024 the SMEWG focused on enhancing connectivity, trade and investment, accessing global value chains, promoting start-ups, and supporting women's economic empowerment. The SMEWG endorsed the PSU report on "Enhancing MSME Data Interoperability in the APEC Region" and held a two-day workshop in Lima, Peru, to understand the role of digital connectivity in formalizing informal businesses in the Asia-Pacific region. The SMEWG also made significant progress in areas such as access to global value chains (GVCs) and innovation, by sharing best practices and individual actions during the 57th and 58th SMEWG meetings.

The TPTWG organized seven project events, including workshops and forums, and published five final reports with key initiatives including discussions on resilient supply chains, mobility integration, and sustainable transport technologies, alongside workshops on gender inclusion in the transport workforce and innovative greenhouse gas reduction strategies.

One of the key achievements of the TWG in 2024 was the publication of the "Establishing a Safe and Sustainable Future for Travel in the Better Normal – Compendium," which details current safe passage policies and provides best practices and recommendations relevant to APEC economies. Additionally, TWG held several workshops, including one on the impact of creative economies on the future of tourism in the APEC region, promoting inclusive and interconnected growth in the tourism sector.

2). Innovation and digitalisation to promote transition to the formal and global economy

Under the leadership of Peru, the SCE and its sub-fora focused on practical efforts to make full use of innovative and digital solutions to promote the transition to the formal and global economy. During the first Senior Officials' Meeting cluster of 2024, Peru hosted the SCE Policy Dialogue "Understanding the Nexus between Digital Connectivity and Formalization in Asia-Pacific". Participating experts shared insights on policies and discussed the role of digital connectivity for formalization in the region.

The HWG hosted a policy dialogue on "Advance Cooperation on Bio Genomic in Healthcare" in March to explore on genomic medicine plans and lessons learned including impact investments, value-based health care, as well as a policy discussion on "Strengthening health human resources for a more resilient health system" in August to discuss the use of data and analysis for health workforce planning.

The HRDWG's initiatives in 2024 focused on enhancing digital skills and literacy. Key projects included the development of a toolkit for high-quality online micro-credential courses aimed at upskilling and reskilling, and the "APEC Digital Education Policy Training (ADEPT) Program 2024," which improved digital capabilities for educators, and stakeholders. Additionally, the "APEC Learning Community for Shared Prosperity (ALCom) 2024" offered digital learning and teaching practices to education stakeholders through virtual training sessions. HRDWG also addressed the digital divide through various publications, such as the "Toolkit for Developing Digital Upskilling Training Program in New Media from the Gender Lens" and the "Digital and Inclusive Talents Cultivation and Technology (AI)-Enabled Collaboration: TVET's Integrative Models of Skills and Trainings - Project Summary Report." In terms of skills and human resource development, the "APEC Workshop on Green Vocational Skills" shared best practices on green vocational skills development with participants and experts from 10 APEC member economies.

In 2024, the TWG made significant strides in promoting innovation and digitalization to facilitate the transition to the formal and global economy. Key deliverables included a workshop, which addressed the impact of creative economies on the future of tourism in the APEC region. Another notable initiative was a workshop,

which focused on fostering digital connectivity as a tool to promote the transition of informal economic actors to the formal economy. Through these initiatives, TWG demonstrated its commitment to leveraging innovation and digitalization to support the formalization and global integration of tourism enterprises.

Further, the HRDWG supported the "2024 APEC Sports Policy Network (ASPN) Meetings," which facilitated a policy dialogue and the exchange of information on promoting sports innovation initiatives, benefiting participants from the APEC region. The "13th APEC Conference on Cooperation in Higher Education - Unleashing the Global Potential" was also held and brought together participants and experts to exchange best practices in higher education systems. Additionally, the "HRD Expert Dialogue: Inclusion and Empowerment of People with Disabilities Using Digital Strategies" provided best practices in empowering people with disabilities into the formal labor market. Policy dialogues on "Advancing Formalization and a Sustainable Future based on the "HRDWG Detroit Non-Binding Principles" and "Challenge of Economic Actors in Transitioning from the Informal to Formal Economy and Policy Response" were held during the HRDWG Labor and Social Protection Network (LSPN) Meeting.

The ATCWG organized a workshop on "Addressing Food Security Challenges by Promoting Data-Driven Policymaking," and conducted a survey and workshop on "Interconnecting Family Farmers with Consumers through Innovative Digital Platforms." These projects encouraged APEC economies to develop policies that promote the adoption of innovative and digital solutions to address challenges including food security as well as supporting family farmers to access a broader marketplace.

During the 58th SMEWG meeting, the theme "Innovation and digitalization to promote transition to the formal and global economy" was developed, with presentations focusing on strategies to deal with informality, such as digitalization of government services, implementation of advisory and mentoring services, joint work with academics and the community, tax benefits, and streamlining MSME regulations. Further, a two-day titled "Study and workshop to understand the role of digital connectivity in the formalization process of informal businesses in the Asia-Pacific region" included a two-day in-person workshop held on 4-5 March 2024 in Lima, Peru.

The PPSTI organized significant events such as the "APEC Workshop on Accelerating Industry 4.0 Technology Adoption in Manufacturing Sectors" and the "APEC Forum on Building Precision Fishery Model Cases with Smart Technology" in 2024. Additionally, PPSTI published key reports like the "APEC Technology Commercialization Demand Side Program Study Report" and the "Innovating for Public Urban Technology Transformation (INPUT2) Competition Report." Capacity building initiatives were also conducted, such as the Capacity Building on Supply Chain Connectivity with Cloud-based Manufacturing Solutions.

Key activities of the TPTWG in 2024 focused on the adoption of new technologies and sustainable transport solutions. Notable workshops addressed the integration of emerging smart technologies and the impact of unmanned aerial systems in aviation. The TPTWG also facilitated collaboration with organizations like the International Civil Aviation Organization and the International Maritime Organization to enhance connectivity and promote safe cross-border movement.

In 2024 the PPWE organized a workshop on "Promoting Gender Equality and Inclusion in Digital Health Technology for Caregivers," which aimed to bridge the digital divide and empower women through digital tools. Additionally, the PPWE conducted a workshop on "Capacity Building for the Reduction of the Digital Gender Inequality," focusing on creating an inclusive digital future for women business owners and entrepreneurs. These workshops provided practical applications of digital technologies to enhance women's participation in the digital economy.

3). Sustainable growth for resilient development

The SCE contributed to the advancement of Peru's priority 'sustainable growth for resilient development' through several initiatives and projects undertaken throughout the year.

The "APEC Symposium on Green and Low-carbon Transition through Digital Technologies," held in China in June brought together around 180 representatives from various APEC economies, who shared knowledge and best practices on topics such as the role of digital technologies in promoting green development, the application of digital technologies to boost the green transition of traditional industries, and the integration of emerging technologies to achieve coordinated development of the digital and low-carbon economies. Further, in September the "APEC Symposium on Sustainable Cities Development to Promote Inclusive and Sustainable Growth in Asia-Pacific," was held virtually. The symposium included sessions on innovative development in transportation, energy, infrastructure, logistics, and waste management, as well as sustainable city planning and infrastructure upgrading to enhance city resilience.

<u>APEC continued the BCG Award</u> in 2024 to recognize the achievements of individuals and organizations that have advanced sustainable and inclusive growth objectives. Three winners from across the APEC region will be officially announced and awarded a USD 5,000 cash prize for their outstanding efforts in furthering replicable BCG Economy approaches across the APEC region at the APEC Ministerial Meeting in Lima, Peru in November 2024.

In 2024, several significant events and workshops were organized by EWG members to promote sustainable and resilient growth. The year began with workshops on the "Promotion of Multifunctional Ocean Space Usage for Renewable Energies Combination in APEC Regions" and the "Regulatory/Market Settings to Support Greater Electrical Energy Storage Development for Sustainable and Socially Responsible Electricity Sector CO2 Emissions Reductions in APEC Economies for Malaysia." Followed by the "Data Driven Carbon Neutral Disaster Resilient Cities" event and the 7th APEC Oil and Gas Security Network Forum. In April, the APEC workshop on "Promoting Sustainable Energy for Small Farmers towards Climate-Friendly Agri Value Chains" was held. May was particularly busy with several events, including the APEC Follow-Up Peer Review on Energy Efficiency (PREE) Phase 13, the workshops on "Stocktaking Challenges and Opportunities for Energy Transition towards Decarbonization", and "Promoting Technology to Contribute to Sustainable Energy Transition." The summer months featured the APEC Retro-Commissioning (RCx) Online Training Scheme, as well as workshops on "Seaweed-Based Sustainable Bioenergy" and "Promoting Digital Solar Resources Maps and Management Technologies." The latter part of the year continued with a strong focus on sustainable energy and decarbonization. In August, the "Award Ceremony of 2024 Energy Smart Communities Initiative (ESCI) Best Practices Awards Program" was held associated with EWG68. In September, the "Promoting Decarbonization of Power Sector by Using Carbon-Free Energy" event took place. Additionally, the EWG reached consensus on the Just Energy Transition Initiative, as directed by ministers in 2023.

The PPWE organised and completed several impactful workshops and dialogues throughout the year. Notable among these were the "APEC Workshop on Women's Empowerment Through Inclusive and Gender-Responsive Climate Policymaking," the "Workshop on Advancing Women in Solutions to Respond to All Environmental Challenges, including Climate Change, Extreme Weather, and Natural Disasters" and the "Seminar on Promoting Gender Equality and Inclusion in Digital Health Technology for Caregivers." These initiatives aimed to address environmental challenges, thereby supporting sustainable growth and resilience.

One of the key achievements for the HRDWG in 2024 was the endorsement of the "APEC HRDWG Arequipa Goals," which aim to empower people with disabilities for sustainable and inclusive economic growth. Additionally, the launch of the HRDWG Friends of the Chair on Promoting Disability Policies seeks to promote sound disability policies. Another notable achievement is the enhancement of capacity building for 68 researchers, practitioners, educators, government agencies, industry players, and communities from eight APEC member economies. This was achieved by deliberating practical solutions in promoting environmental education and education for sustainable development for post-disaster recovery during the "APEC Conference on Sustainability and Environmental Education for Post Disaster" held in August. Furthermore, by endorsing the APEC HRDWG Labor and Social Protection Network Action Plan 2025-2026, the HRDWG demonstrated its commitment to foster strong and flexible labor markets as well as to strengthen labor and social protection measures.

In 2024 the EGILAT adopted the third two-year policy theme, EGILAT Policy Theme III (2024-2025) "Promoting Legal Timber Trade through Enhanced Stakeholder Collaboration for Effective Implementation and Enforcement." Additionally, the EGILAT published an updated compendium on "Advancing the Trade and Distribution of Legally Harvested Forest Products: Navigating to Legal Timber". Further, a research paper was published on "Developing Integrated Timber Data to Enhance Legal Timber Trade of the APEC through Xylaria Networking" with a three-day training for government officers and industries on wood identification methods and tools.

Within the HWG, the main deliverables for 2024 focus on several key areas, including gender equality and health, community mental health, climate change and health, and immunization across the life-course. In the area of gender equality and health, various policy discussions and panel discussions were hosted to explore topics such as the renewal of the Healthy Women, Healthy Economies Policy Toolkit, the APEC Roadmap to Promote Sustainable Economic Advancement for Women through Cervical Cancer Prevention, and the APEC Smart Families initiative. These discussions aimed to address issues like demographic resilience, health access for women, and the impact of climate change on women's health.

The HWG also facilitated policy discussions and panel discussions on climate change and health focused on strengthening health systems to address new and re-emerging disease pandemics resulting from climate change. Further, Peru sought to bring greater attention to the growing climate-related threats and their disproportionate impact on vulnerable communities with an EPWG workshop on "Enhancing Prevention and Risk Reduction for Climate Change Adaptation in Vulnerable Communities in the Asia-Pacific Region."

The PPSTI advanced APEC's broader sustainability goals with numerous project events, workshops and dialogues integrating science and technology to advance environmental objectives. This included a workshop addressing "Innovation Ecosystems for Resilience Solutions," with a focus on biodiversity. Additionally, an APEC Climate Symposium was held, aimed at supporting a sustainable and resilient society through enhanced El Niño/Southern Oscillation response and preparedness. Collaborative projects were implemented, including the development of knowledge discovery approaches for predicting water deficit risk and promoting circular economy in the construction industry using industrial symbiosis. Furthermore, a PPSTI Symposium focused on strengthening capacities to increase access and use of traditional knowledge, with an emphasis on biodiversity (including agrobiodiversity) in the ecosystem of science, technology, and innovation also took place in 2024.

The OFWG continued to implement three key roadmaps: the Roadmap on Marine Debris, the Roadmap on Combatting Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing, and the Roadmap on Small-scale Fisheries and Aquaculture in 2024. The OFWG began discussions on the report on combatting IUU fishing in 2025 and the development of the Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Combatting IUU Fishing. Efforts to enhance the capacity of APEC economies include the resumption of discussions on the Implementation Plan for the Roadmap on Small-scale Fisheries and Aquaculture. New initiatives under discussion include the Virtual Working Group on Port State Measure (PSM) Challenges and the Coastal Resilience Framework for the APEC Region.

In 2024, TWG contributed to sustainable growth for resilient development through various initiatives and deliverables. One of the key achievements was the publication of the report "Assessing the Impact of Rising Sea Levels on Travel and Tourism in APEC Economies," which highlighted the risks posed by sea level rise and extreme sea events to APEC economies and provided recommendations for policymakers. Additionally, TWG published the Tourism Crisis Communication Plan, which covers government, municipality, and industry communication with tourists to provide necessary information for crisis management in tourist destinations. TWG also held several workshops, including one on youth involvement in the development of sustainable and safe tourism in remote areas of APEC economies, another on best practices in sustainable tourism management in conservation, fragile, and protected areas, and a series of training workshops on rebuilding rural tourism by utilising green recovery strategies.

The TPTWG conducted workshops focused on strategies to enhance sustainable and safe mobility within APEC economies, alongside discussions on the advancement of low and zero emissions technologies. The TPTWG also published reports addressing maritime transport challenges and innovative greenhouse gas reduction

strategies. Furthermore, the outcomes of the 54th TPTWG meeting established a foundation for future policy themes, aimed at improving accessibility and fostering a sustainable and inclusive transport workforce across APEC member economies.

The ATCWG made significant strides in 2024 with several key deliverables aimed at enhancing food security and promoting sustainable agricultural practices. One of the major achievements was the "Trujillo Principles for Preventing and Reducing Food Loss and Waste," developed in collaboration with the Policy Partnership on Food Security (PPFS). The Trujillo Principles focus on strengthening institutional frameworks, promoting public-private partnerships, fostering research and innovation, improving data collection, and encouraging food rescue and donation to enhance food security and sustainability.

Additionally, the ATCWG focused on promoting sustainable and inclusive economic growth through key initiatives and several important workshops covering topics using biomass energy from agricultural waste and its role in climate policy and finance, enhancing arable land resources and promoting food security, digital transformation in agriculture, climate change adaptation, food loss and waste reduction, smallholder empowerment, and sustainable rural development.

3.2 Advancing the Implementation of the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040

The APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and its implementation plan, the Aotearoa Plan of Action (APA) sets aspirations and objectives for the APEC region until 2040, focusing on three economic drivers: Trade and Investment; Innovation and Digitalization; and Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable, and Inclusive Growth. APEC economies were encouraged to voluntarily showcase their individual actions based on the APA. In 2024, two economies updated the SCE on their efforts to advance APA individual actions, covering a range of areas and actions. One economy proposed a further enhancement of the biennial evaluation of progress in the implementation of the APV2040.

At SCE1 Australia detailed its implementation of a procurement-connected policy that applies to all noncorporate Commonwealth entities in support of Indigenous business titled the Indigenous Procurement Policy (IPP). Australia reported that the IPP is effectively increasing indigenous economic participation through portfolio targets for domestic contracts, mandatory set asides and obligatory minimum indigenous participation requirements. Additional work included the introduction of a database and certification system for verified Indigenous businesses.

Additionally, at SCE1 the United States updated members on its federal sustainability plan, which has resulted in the increased use of renewable energy and energy efficient vehicles as well as the design of energy efficient buildings by government agencies to support the achievement of the United States' net zero emissions by 2050 goal. Further, the Greening Government Initiative launched in 2021 encourages economies to share sustainability best practices and innovations, while the US Department of Agriculture launched a new food security dashboard to provide policymakers with information on food requirements and distribution around the globe.

Intersessionally, the SCE agreed to the "Integrating APEC's Inclusive Growth Agendas" paper incorporating the review of the 2017 APEC Action Agenda on Advancing Economic, Financial, and Social Inclusion into the existing review and reporting requirements of the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 and the Aotearoa Plan of Action to avoid duplication and streamline efforts.

At SCE3 Australia presented on its progress in implementing individual actions under the APA, focusing on disability equality. Australia detailed its <u>disability strategy</u>, which was launched in 2021. Australia informed that the strategy aims to create an inclusive Australian society where people with disabilities can fulfil their potential as equal members of the community. Key actions included developing a roadmap to improve health outcomes for people with intellectual disabilities, investing in early support programs for infants and children, and developing new standards for airline travel to make it more inclusive.

3.3 Progress in Implementation of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities

In 2024 the SCE sub-fora made important contributions to the achievement of the APV2040 and APA objectives as evidenced by their advancement of the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities. All assessed SCE sub-fora work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities.

3.4 Fora Administration

a. Ensuring alignment of SCE Fora Governance Documents

In line with the SCE Terms of Reference, the SCE is tasked with coordinating action-oriented and integrated strategies as per the commitments of Leaders and Ministers. In 2024, the SCE played a pivotal role in assisting its sub-fora to make adequate provisions for implementing the APV2040, including through the APA, within their work plans, strategic plans, and terms of reference. Consequently, with the SCE's support, the sub-fora successfully integrated the updated ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities (the ECOTECH-related collective actions) into their work plans and end-of-year reports, utilizing existing templates and reporting structures.

b. Approving Strategic Plans

As of 1 October 2024, the SCE approved one Strategic Plan in 2024: The SMEWG Strategic Plan (2025-2028). Work remains ongoing at the sub-fora level with a view towards having all expired or expiring strategic plans, including EWG (2019-2023); OFWG (2021-2023); PPWE (2019-2021) and TPTWG (2020-2024) updated before the end of the 2024 calendar year.

c. Approving Annual Work Plans

The Terms of Reference of the SCE mandates the Committee to "assess and direct realignment of individual work plans of Working Groups and SOM Policy Partnerships with the APEC-wide medium-term ECOTECH priorities and annual objectives as outlined in the ECOTECH framework" and stipulates that "to this purpose, all Working Groups and Policy Partnerships should submit their strategic and annual work plans to the SCE." As such, 13 work plans were submitted and all were approved in 2024 (as reflected in Table One).

In addition, the Executive Director of the APEC Secretariat presented a report: '2024 Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work: Alignment, Synergies, and Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action' (Annex 1), which noted that all assessed sub-fora work plans made linkages between their specific activities and APEC 2024 themes and priorities.

Further, all assessed SCE sub-fora work plans made provisions for the implementation of the APV2040, including through the APA. Additionally, SCE sub-fora work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities.

In 2024, SCE fora work plans hewed closely to the same mix of priorities as is 2023 with 61% (60% in 2023) of planned work contributing to ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities under Driver Three: Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth; 29% (30% in 2023) to Driver Two: Innovation and Digitalization; and 10% (10% in 2023) to Driver One: Trade and Investment.

In 2024, roughly 85% of ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities were incorporated into SCE fora work plans compared to 88% in 2023. No SCE fora workplans identified activities, projects or initiatives that would contribute to the following ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in 2024:

- Deepen APEC's multi-stakeholder engagement and collaboration on digital issues, especially with business.
- Accelerate APEC work and capacity building on the digital economy, including by prompt & effective implementation of APEC's Internet & Digital Economy Roadmap.
- Building on APEC's work on supporting MSMEs' and women's economic empowerment and cooperate to further develop APEC's work on other groups with untapped economic potential, such as indigenous peoples as appropriate, people with disabilities, and those from remote and rural communities.
- Enhance cooperation to foster secure growth, including by implementing the APEC Beijing Declaration on Fighting Corruption, Santiago Commitment to Fight Corruption and Ensure Transparency, and the APEC Consolidated Counterterrorism and Secure Trade Strategy.
- Build on existing APEC work on mutual recognition of qualifications to deepen and widen its coverage.
- Cooperate in relevant APEC fora to develop, encourage, and exchange best practice policies, and promote capacity building programs, that address all environmental challenges including climate change, support sustainable growth, such as through:
- o structural reform;
- o trade, including APEC's work on facilitation of trade in environmental goods and services;
- public finance, including tax policy and rationalizing & phasing out inefficient fossil fuel subsidies that encourage wasteful consumption, while recognizing the importance of providing those in need with essential energy services.
- Advance APEC's circular economy work.

3.5 Cross-Fora Collaboration

In 2024 SCE sub-fora identified approximately 240 cooperation opportunities, which includes both cross-fora collaboration and external stakeholder partnerships (an increase from approximately 200 in 2023). Across all 14 SCE sub-fora work plans there are 134 APEC and non-APEC entities with which SCE sub-fora plan to cooperate in 2024. Some of these entities repeat many times across multiple work plans (for instance the OECD, ASEAN, PPWE and EWG are identified for cooperation opportunities across several SCE sub-fora work plans) and some only appear in one work plan (i.e. Global Timber Forum and TELWG appear in one SCE sub-fora work plan respectively). This is an increase from 121 unique cooperation opportunities identified in 2023. Of the total number of opportunities for cooperation, 120 or 50% were cross fora in nature (33% in 2023). The most active sub-fora in terms of both cross fora collaboration and stakeholder engagement were EPWG, PPSTI, EWG, HRDWG, SMEWG and TPTWG. In keeping with the findings of the 2022 and 2023 reports, TELWG, identified the fewest cross fora collaboration and external partnership opportunities in 2024.

As outlined in the 2023 report, potential collaboration was identified with other SCE sub-fora as well as with the Economic Committee, the Committee on Trade and Investment along with their sub-fora, as well as the Finance Ministers Process/Senior Finance Officials' Meeting. Collaboration was not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather was diverse, and often differed from project to project.

Several SCE sub-fora identified collaboration with external partners in their events or activities as per the principles and procedures for managing cooperation between APEC and non-member entities and individuals. Eight work plans explicitly identified potential collaborations with ABAC, an improvement from a total of seven in 2023 and five in 2022. The most frequently cited partners for cross-fora collaboration in SCE fora work plans included: DESG, EWG, SMEWG, PPWE, HRDWG, PPSTI, EPWG, ATCWG, HWG and PPFS (see Graph 3). The least often cited SCE sub-fora for cross fora collaboration were TELWG and EGILAT, both of which were identified in only one work plan.

External partnerships formed the bulk of the collaborative opportunities detailed in 2024 SCE sub-fora work plans. The most frequently cited external partners included: The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD); The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN); The World Bank; The International Labour Organization (ILO); The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP); The Asian Development Bank (ADB); the World Health Organization (WHO); The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO); The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC); and The United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) (see Graph Four).

In 2024, cross-fora collaboration was exemplified through various initiatives. Reflecting the cross-cutting nature of its work, the HRDWG reported ten projects to the APEC Business Advisory Council (ABAC), supporting recommendations to APEC Economic Leaders. These projects covered key areas such as skills for green products and services, education in STEM fields, generative AI initiatives, digitalization, and reskilling and upskilling for lifelong learning.

ABAC presented recommendations to promote just, ambitious, and realistic energy transitions, greener trade frameworks, sustainable growth for the electric vehicle supply chains, and other clean energy and efficiency recommendations for the EWG. Additionally, the EWG Lead Shepherd delivered video presentations for the APEC HRDWG Labor and Social Protection Network and the APEC workshop on 'Advancing Occupational Safety and Health for the Workforce in Green Energy Sectors.'

At the EGILAT meetings, the ACTWG and the Sub-Committee on Customs Procedures (SCCP) shared information on their respective mandates and potential areas of collaboration. The ACTWG Chair also attended the EGILAT cross-fora session, discussing potential collaboration areas. Furthermore, the PPWE Chair attended the 39th ACTWG Meeting, presenting on the impact of corruption on women and the need to mainstream gender in anti-corruption efforts.

The HWG plenary meetings were supported by representatives from the PPWE, the World Health Organization (WHO), the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), the APEC Digital Hub for Mental Health, the APEC Vaccine Task Force, academia, and the private sector. The HWG also hosted the "Advancing Empowerment, Inclusion, and Growth: APEC Women's Health Policy Dialogue" during SOM3, where the PPWE Chair discussed formalizing and sustaining attention to women's health. At the 14th High-Level Meeting on Health and the Economy (HLMHE), representatives from ABAC, the World Bank, and PAHO provided insights on promoting trade liberalization, trade facilitation, and investment to strengthen health systems.

The PPSTI actively engaged in cross-fora collaboration in 2024, covering a wide range of cross-cutting issues. At the PPSTI 23 meeting, the ABAC Executive Director presented recommendations and the 2024 Work Plan, highlighting the need for practical actions towards equity, sustainability, and opportunity. The PPWE Chair also

presented on Women-In-STEM activities at the PPSTI 24 meeting, and delegates brainstormed potential future cross-fora collaboration opportunities.

The TELWG exchanged views with the Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG) on the US selffunded project, "Low-Earth Orbit (LEO) Satellite Technology Alternatives to Increase Connectivity for Rural and Remote Communities". The EPWG also discussed Japan's CTI Concept Note on "Quality Infrastructure Investments to Address Environmental Challenges in APEC Cities". The TELWG invited other groups to attend its workshops, including a joint TEL-PPWE workshop on APEC Digital Innovation for Women's Advancement and a TEL workshop on Indigenous Digital Inclusion.

In 2024, the ATCWG worked closely with the PPFS on various projects and workshops. These included the "Workshop on Indigenous Research Network," the "Workshop on Addressing Food Security Challenges by Promoting Data-Driven Policymaking," and the "APEC Workshop on Enhancing Arable Land Resources and Promoting Food Security."

The PPWE made significant contributions to cross-fora collaboration, enhancing gender equality and women's economic empowerment across various APEC work streams. Notably, PPWE engaged with the EPWG to mainstream gender in disaster risk reduction and emergency preparedness. Additionally, PPWE participated in a Joint Meeting of Ministers Responsible for Women and Ministers Responsible for Trade, discussing obstacles and best practices to promote women's economic empowerment through trade. The PPWE also held a Joint Dialogue with the APEC Economic Committee (EC), focusing on the proposal of APEC Gender Equality Structural Reform Principles to advance women's economic empowerment. Throughout the year, the PPWE Chair presented opportunities for cross-fora collaboration at various plenary meetings, including those of the HRDWG, ACTWG, and PPSTI.

3.6 2024-2025 SCE Standardized Sub-fora Assessment Exercise

Following the agreement of SCE members in November 2023 to a process, template and timelines for the 2024-2025 SCE Standardized Sub-fora Assessment Exercise, the SCE undertook seven SCE sub-fora assessments in three phases over the course of 2024. The assessments were undertaken as follows: The Phase I assessment included the SMEWG with the SCE providing a recommendation and Senior Officials' agreeing to renew the SMEWG at SOM1; the Phase II assessments included ACTWG, EGILAT and PPSTI with the SCE providing a recommendation and Senior Officials' agreement was not reached on a recommendation related to the EGILAT. The Phase III assessments included: OFWG, EWG and PPWE with the SCE providing a recommendation and Senior Officials' agreeing to renew the three sub-fora in question at SOM3. Additionally, and following intersessional discussions, the SCE also recommended Senior Officials agreeing to the renewal of the EGILAT at SOM3. The recommendations, with follow-up actions to be undertaken by the SCE sub-fora are included in Annex Two of this report.
3.7 APEC Support Fund

In 2004, Ministers endorsed Australia's proposal to set up the APEC Support Fund (ASF) to serve as a flexible funding mechanism. The ASF aims to meet the capacity building needs for developing economy members in APEC's agreed high priority sectors for economic and technical cooperation. Since its inception, the fund has received contributions from many economies.

Voluntary contributions by APEC members to the ASF and its sub-funds in 2024 (as of 1 October 2024) were provided by 5 economies:

- Australia provided USD 262,208 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Enhanced APEC Agenda for Structural Reform.
- Japan provided USD 593,493 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Energy Efficiency, Low Carbon, and Energy Resiliency Measures.
- Hong Kong, China provided USD 1,000,000 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Strengthening Economic Legal Infrastructure.
- Korea provided USD 700,000 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Digital Innovation.
- New Zealand provided USD 1,059,135 to the ASF Sub-Fund on Structural Reform and Sustainable Green Growth.

4. SCE Sub-Fora in Action

The work of SCE is evident in the number and scope of its 14 sub-fora and the projects overseen by those sub-fora.

A total of 105 Concept Notes (CNs) were funded across two projects sessions in 2024 for SCE Sub-fora. In 2024 the approval rate for all APEC CNs applying to the ASF sub-funds (i.e. excluding ASF General), was 89% (75% for SCE sub-fora CNs only) across both project sessions, compared with 95% in 2023, 100% in 2022 and 89% in 2021. The overall approval rate for GPA, TILF and ASF General Fund was 60% (72% for SCE sub-fora CNs only) with 87 applications submitted and 52 funded in-principle in 2024.

In closing, the achievements of 2024 underscore the value of sustained cooperation, and the insights gained from this year's initiatives provide a solid foundation for future endeavours. As we move forward, the active engagement and commitment of all stakeholders will remain critical to realising APEC's long-term vision for a more prosperous, inclusive, and sustainable Asia-Pacific region.

ANNEX 1: Report of the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on Fora Work: Alignment, Synergies, and Implementation of the Putrajaya Vision 2040 including through the Aotearoa Plan of Action

Executive Summary:

This is the APEC Secretariat Executive Director's annual report on how SCE sub-fora work plans align with APEC's vision and objectives. In line with APEC's focus on strengthening Economic and Technical Cooperation (ECOTECH), the report covers the SCE's strategic assessments of all fourteen SCE-endorsed SCE sub-fora work plans and identified the following findings and recommendations with the aim of improving ECOTECH:

- Alignment with APEC Priorities: All fourteen SCE sub-fora have integrated APEC 2024 host priorities, made provisions for implementing the APEC Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040) and included commitments to other strategic priorities in their work plans. This includes referencing key mandates from Leaders and Ministers, such as the La Serena Roadmap on Women and Inclusive Growth, the Bangkok Goals on Bio-Circular-Green Economy, and the APEC Connectivity Blueprint.
- Linkages with ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities: SCE Sub-Fora's activities are closely tied to ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, facilitating the achievement of APEC's ECOTECH objectives. While there is a slight decrease in coverage of ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities compared to 2023, most priorities are well incorporated. Work plans predominantly contribute to ECOTECH priorities under the APV2040 economic driver: Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth, with fewer activities targeting Innovation and Digitalization or Trade and Investment.
- Cross-Fora Collaboration and Stakeholder Engagement: The report highlights cross-fora collaboration and stakeholder engagement as essential components of the SCE sub-fora work plans, with emphasis on partnerships both within and outside APEC. Collaboration opportunities within and across SCE sub-fora increased in 2024, with approximately 240 areas identified for potential collaboration and 134 unique partnerships recognised.
- Gaps: Despite overall alignment with APEC goals, gaps persist for certain ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities and collaboration with specific partners. There is a need for deeper collaboration among APEC Fora and with external stakeholders including the private sector to enhance the impact and effectiveness of APEC initiatives.

Recommendations: i. enhance coverage of all ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, fostering greater collaboration with key partners, and ii. maximize the impact of SCE sub-fora activities through strategic alignment with APEC's broader agenda, while respecting the expertise and independence of SCE sub-fora.

Conclusion: The 2024 assessment underscores the alignment of SCE fora work plans with APEC's strategic goals and highlights the importance of ongoing collaboration and prioritisation of key initiatives for inclusive and sustainable growth within the region. SOMs are invited to note this report.

Main Report

- 1. In line with the recommendations for *Strengthening Economic and Technical Cooperation in APEC* issued in 2010, the APEC Secretariat Executive Director provides an annual report on how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objectives.
- 2. The SCE sub-fora annual work plans are tabled at the annual SCE-Committee-of-the-Whole Meeting (SCE-COW) for approval in accordance with the recommendations of the 2010 ECOTECH Report.
- 3. The SCE also tasked "the Secretariat to undertake a strategic assessment of synergies within the ECOTECH agenda after SOM1 and provide recommendations to SCE2 highlighting gaps that may require SCE attention or direction" (point 7 of *SCE Report on Improving ECOTECH in APEC* (2013/SOM3/030)).
- 4. The first report by the APEC Secretariat (2014/SOM2/SCE/004) was submitted to the SCE2 in 2014. The second report was presented to the SCE2 in 2015.
- 5. In 2020, Leaders agreed to the Putrajaya Vision 2040 (APV2040), charting APEC's course for the next 20 years. Leaders asked APEC fora and sub-fora to make provision for the implementation of the APV2040 including through the Aotearoa Action Plan (APA), in their terms of reference, work plans and strategic plans.
- 6. In 2022 the SCE reviewed the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities to ensure alignment with APEC overarching vision and objectives as are outlined in the APV2040 and APA. Members undertook an extensive mapping exercise and determined that the previous ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities were well integrated into the APA's collective actions. Members proceeded to identify a subset of ECOTECH-related collective actions, which the SCE then agreed to adopt as the ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities for the SCE's next five-year cycle.
- Further, in an effort to avoid duplication, in 2022 the APEC Executive Director rationalized the <u>Report of</u> <u>the APEC Secretariat Executive Director on the Alignment of Fora Work Plans with APEC's Overall Vision</u> <u>and Objectives</u> and the <u>SCE Report on Synergies within the ECOTECH Agenda</u> report into the following, consolidated report.
- 8. This combined annual report will examine how SCE sub-fora work plans address APEC's overall vision and objectives, provide recommendations on any gaps in the ECOTECH agenda that may require SCE direction or attention, and offer information on the status of the implementation of the APV2040 including through the APA in SCE sub-fora work plans.

Status of SCE Sub-fora Work Plans and Alignment with Broader APEC Objectives

9. The SCE has reviewed and approved all fourteen sub-fora work plans as of 16 April, 2024: Agricultural Technical Cooperation Working Group (ATCWG); Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG); Emergency Preparedness Working Group (EPWG); Energy Working Group (EWG); Experts Group on Illegal Logging and Associated Trade (EGILAT); Health Working Group (HWG); Human Resources Development Working Group (HRDWG); Ocean and Fisheries Working Group (OFWG); Policy

Partnership for Science, Technology, and Innovation (PPSTI); Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy (PPWE); Small and Medium Enterprises Working Group (SMEWG); Telecommunications and Information Working Group (TELWG); Tourism Working Group (TWG); and Transportation Working Group (TPTWG).

- 10. Of the fourteen work plans assessed, all considered mandates from Leaders and Ministers: All (14) reference La Serena Roadmap on Women and Inclusive Growth; 43% or six work plans reference the APEC Internet and Digital Economy Roadmap (AIDER);¹⁶ 29% or four work plans reference the APEC Connectivity Blueprint;¹⁷ and 79% or eleven reference the Bangkok Goals on Bio-Circular-Green (BCG) Economy.¹⁸
- 11. All assessed sub-fora work plans made linkages between their specific activities and APEC 2024 priorities of: (1). *Trade and investment for inclusive and interconnected growth;* (2). *Innovation and digitalization to promote transition to the formal and global economy; and (3). Sustainable growth for resilient development.*¹⁹
- 12. All assessed SCE sub-fora work plans made provisions for the implement the APV2040, including through the APA.
- 13. All assessed SCE sub-fora work plans also make linkages between their specific activities and the relevant ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities, which is facilitated by the template. A more detailed breakdown is included below:

- 14. The APA's ECOTECH-related Collective Actions are reflected as ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in all SCE fora work plans, thus directly linking the work of SCE fora to the implementation of APA actions to advance the APV2040.
- 15. In 2024, SCE fora work plans hewed closely to the same mix of priorities as is 2023 with 61% (60% in 2023) of planned work contributing to ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities under Driver Three: Strong, Balanced, Secure, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth; 29% (30% in 2023) to Driver Two: Innovation and Digitalization; and 10% (10% in 2023) to Driver One: Trade and Investment.
- 16. In 2024, roughly 85% of ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities were incorporated into SCE fora work plans compared to 88% in 2023. No SCE fora workplans identified activities, projects or initiatives that would contribute to the following ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities in 2024:
 - Deepen APEC's multi-stakeholder engagement and collaboration on digital issues, especially with business.
 - Accelerate APEC work & capacity building on the digital economy, including by prompt & effective implementation of APEC's Internet & Digital Economy Roadmap.
 - Building on APEC's work on supporting MSMEs' and women's economic empowerment and cooperate to further develop APEC's work on other groups with untapped economic potential, such as indigenous peoples as appropriate, people with disabilities, and those from remote and rural communities.
 - Enhance cooperation to foster secure growth, including by implementing the APEC Beijing Declaration on Fighting Corruption, Santiago Commitment to Fight Corruption and Ensure Transparency, and the APEC Consolidated Counter-Terrorism and Secure Trade Strategy.
 - Build on existing APEC work on mutual recognition of qualifications to deepen and widen its coverage.
 - Cooperate in relevant APEC fora to develop, encourage, and exchange best practice policies, and promote capacity building programs, that address all environmental challenges including climate change, support sustainable growth, such as through:
 - o structural reform;
 - o trade, including APEC's work on facilitation of trade in environmental goods and services;
 - public finance, including tax policy and rationalizing & phasing out inefficient fossil fuel subsidies that encourage wasteful consumption, while recognizing the importance of providing those in need with essential energy services.
 - Advance APEC's circular economy work.

Synergies and Strategic Assessment

17. The strategic assessment of work plans led to the following conclusions:

17.1 Similar to 2023's findings, in 2024 several SCE sub-fora work plans focused on primary ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities to which their work would contribute, omitting ancillary Medium-Term Priorities, against which the fora's efforts are more tangentially linked.

17.2 In 2024 SCE sub-fora identified approximately 240 cooperation opportunities, which includes both cross-fora collaboration and external stakeholder partnerships (an increase from approximately 200 in 2023). Across all 14 SCE sub-fora work plans there are 134 APEC and non-APEC entities with

which SCE sub-fora plan to cooperate in 2024. Some of these entities repeat many times across multiple work plans (for instance the OECD, ASEAN, PPWE and EWG are identified for cooperation opportunities across several SCE sub-fora work plans) and some only appear in one work plan (i.e. Global Timber Forum and TELWG appear in one SCE sub-fora work plan respectively). This is an increase from 121 unique cooperation opportunities identified in 2023. Of the total number of opportunities for cooperation, 120 or 50% were cross fora in nature (33% in 2023). The most active sub-fora in terms of both cross fora collaboration and stakeholder engagement were EPWG, PPSTI, EWG, HRDWG, SMEWG and TPTWG. In keeping with the findings of the 2022 and 2023 report, TELWG, identified the fewest cross fora collaboration and external partnership opportunities in 2024.

17.3 As outlined in the 2023 report, potential collaboration was identified with other SCE sub-fora as well as with the Economic Committee, the Committee on Trade and Investment along with their sub-fora, as well as the Finance Ministers Process/Senior Finance Officials' Meeting. Collaboration was not confined to the same or the more obvious partners but rather was diverse, and often differed from project to project.

- 17.4 Several SCE sub-fora identified collaboration with external partners in their events or activities as per the principles and procedures for managing cooperation between APEC and non-member entities and individuals.²⁰ Eight work plans explicitly identified potential collaborations with ABAC, an improvement from a total of seven in 2023 and five in 2022. The most frequently cited partners for cross-fora collaboration in SCE fora work plans included: DESG, EWG, SMEWG, PPWE, HRDWG, PPSTI, EPWG, ATCWG, HWG and PPFS (see Graph 3). The least often cited SCE sub-fora for cross fora collaboration were TELWG and EGILAT, both of which were identified in only one work plan.
- 17.5 External partnerships formed the bulk of the collaborative opportunities detailed in 2024 SCE subfora work plans. The most frequently cited external partners included: The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD); The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN); The World Bank; The International Labour Organization (ILO); The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP); The Asian Development Bank (ADB); the World Health Organization (WHO); The Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO); The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC); and The United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) (see Graph Four).

Gaps

- 18 Many of the findings from the 2023 report continue to be valid, as there remains significant scope for more frequent collaboration with the partners and stakeholders, such as the WTO and the Pacific Islands Forum, given their respective roles within the broader APEC process.
- 19 Additionally, the instruction to SCE sub-fora to consider the possible contributions of planned projects, actions, and initiatives to both directly and indirectly linked ECOTECH Medium-Term Priorities remains a salient recommendation, given the ongoing gap in coverage for certain priorities.

ANNEX 2: SCE Standardised Sub-fora Assessment Recommendations (Phase I, II and III)

Phase I: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the SMEWG

The SCE met on 6 March 2024 and recommended the renewal of the SMEWG with the following follow-up instructions for SMEWG action:

- 1. SMEWG and subsidiary bodies to draft and submit to SCE for approval by 31 December 2024, Terms of References with a four-year time horizon.
- 2. SMEWG to review all satellite websites and instruct relevant member economies to update and/or discontinue based on SMEWG assessment and agreement. SMEWG is requested to report back at SCE3 on status.
- 3. SMEWG to review and reflect SCE recommendations on cross for collaboration and use of data in update to the SMEWG Strategic Plan.

Phase II: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the ACTWG

The SCE met on 14 May 2024 and recommended the renewal of the ACTWG with the following follow-up instructions for ACTWG action:

- 1. ACTWG and its subsidiary bodies to draft Terms of References with a four-year time horizon as well as sunset clauses and submit to SCE for approval by 31 December 2025.
- 2. ACTWG to review satellite websites and instruct relevant member economies to update and/or discontinue with regular reporting to the SCE, as relevant.
- 3. ACTWG to carefully consider and report back by SCE3 on actions to address recommendations on soliciting project ideas from members, increasing cross fora collaboration, strengthening engagement with multilateral anticorruption institutions as well as further improving the process of defining thematic priorities each year.

Phase II: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the EGILAT

The SCE met on 23 August 2024 and recommended the renewal of the EGILAT with the following followup instructions for the EGILAT's action:

- 1. The EGILAT to draft a Terms of Reference (ToRs) with a four-year time horizon as well as sunset clause and submit to SCE for approval by 31 December 2025.
- 2. The EGILAT to explore ways of improving meeting arrangements such as the quality of agendas, meeting frequency and hybrid/virtual attendance options.
- 3. The EGILAT to work to improve its work plan and strategic plan and to explore expanding the EGILAT's thematic focus to include wood products trade, among others.
- 4. The EGILAT to invest in efforts to increase the quantity while retaining the quality of its multiyear projects.
- 5. The EGILAT to pursue greater cross-fora collaboration opportunities.
- 6. The EGILAT to report back to SCE on the renewal process in 2025.

Phase II: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the PPSTI

The SCE met on 14 May 2024 and recommended the renewal of the PPSTI with the following follow-up instructions for PPSTI action:

- 1. PPSTI and its subsidiary bodies to draft Terms of References (ToRs) with a four-year time horizon as well as sunset clauses and submit to SCE for approval by 31 December 2025.
- 2. PPSTI TOR to incorporate the Guidelines for the Establishment, Management and Review of APEC Centres of the PPSTI ('The Guidelines').
- 3. PPSTI to notify APEC Centres when they are to present at PPSTI (see section 6.1 of the Guidelines).
- 4. PPSTI to review all satellite websites and instruct relevant member economies to update websites non-compliant with APEC policies and/or discontinue.
- 5. PPSTI to invest in efforts to increase the quality of projects for example by exploring mechanisms to avoid duplication of topics and increase the impact of project outcomes through multiyear projects.
- 6. PPSTI to report back to SCE on the renewal process.

Phase III: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the EWG

The SCE met on 23 August 2024 and recommended the renewal of the EWG with the following follow-up instructions for the EWG's action:

- The EWG, Expert Groups, Research Centres, Task Forces and Satellite Websites (APEC Energy Standards Information System (ESIS) and The Energy Smart Communities Initiative (ESCI) to draft ToRs with four-year time horizons, sunset clauses and submit for SCE approval in advance of 31 December 2025.
- 2. The Expert Groups, Research Centres and Task Forces ToRs to commit to reporting back to EWG annually; to adhering to APEC guidelines and policies, including ensuring that APEC-branded outputs are first endorsed by EWG.
- 3. The EWG to update its' Strategic Plan.
- 4. The EWG to review all websites and instruct relevant members to update/ discontinue websites non-compliant with APEC policies or out of date. In the event no economy is responsible for a website, it is to be discontinued.
- 5. The EWG to report to SCE on its actions by SCE1 in 2025

Phase III: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the OFWG

The SCE met on 23 August 2024 and recommended the renewal of the OFWG with the following follow- up instructions for the OFWG's action:

- 1. The OFWG, specialised centre and sub-body to draft ToRs with four-year time horizons, sunset clauses and submit for SCE approval in advance of 31 December 2025.
- 2. The OFWG, specialised centre and sub-body ToRs to commit to reporting back to OFWG annually; to adhering to APEC guidelines and policies, including ensuring that centres' APEC-branded outputs are first endorsed by OFWG.
- 3. The OFWG to update its Strategic Plan to increase impact on regional policymaking.
- 4. The OFWG to improve meeting agendas for more impactful discussion and collaboration with other multilateral fisheries bodies, seeking alignment and avoiding overlap.
- 5. The OFWG to review all websites and instruct relevant members to update/ discontinue websites non-compliant with APEC policies or out of date.
- 6. The Discussion Group on establishing a new virtual subgroup on discussing port measures aimed at combating IUU fishing to finalize its status, name and ToR.
- 7. The OFWG to report to SCE on its actions by SCE1 in 2025.

Phase III: SCE Recommendation on the Renewal of the PPWE

The SCE met on 23 August 2024 and recommended the renewal of the PPWE with the following follow- up instructions for the PPWE's action:

- 1. PPWE to draft Terms of References (ToRs) with a four-year time horizon as well as sunset clauses and submit to SCE for approval by 31 December 2025.
- 2. PPWE to review all satellite websites and instruct relevant member economies to update websites non-compliant with APEC policies and/or discontinue. In the event no economy is responsible for a website, it is to be discontinued.
- 3. PPWE to update its Strategic Plan
- 4. PPWE to invest in efforts to publish frameworks, principles and toolkits that can easily be shared and strengthen their dissemination.
- 5. PPWE to report back to SCE on the renewal process by SCE1 2025.
